- Pokagon environmental programs  
Since federal recognition in 1994, the Pokagon Band of Potawatomi (Pokagon Band) is taking progressive steps to restore and ecologically enhance their traditional land base. Their first objective was to re-create historic wetlands. [They are working to control] the encroaching and highly invasive reed canary grass growing on their property that will cause trouble for their native wetland plant species such as lake and river wild rice. – US Fish & Wildlife Service
  
- Galien River County Park  
[Galien River County Park] in New Buffalo Township [includes] a mix of upland and wetland habitats along the Galien River. The wetland area is particularly significant in that it is a part of the larger "New Buffalo Marsh," a Great Lakes marsh that formed along the Galien River just upstream from the river's mouth at Lake Michigan. Highlights ... include a 300' Canopy Walkway that leads to a 60' high Marsh Overlook Tower and a 600' long Marsh Boardwalk that leads to River Viewing and Fishing Platform. – Berrien County Michigan Website
  
- Galien River Sanitary District  
The GRSD Sewer Authority is an intergovernmental agency responsible for wastewater treatment in southwestern Berrien County, serving the cities of New Buffalo and Bridgman as well as New Buffalo, Chikaming and Lake Townships. – GRSD Sewer Authority Website
